From the Headteacher

I am so delighted that Mr Martin Atkinson has been selected to take over from me next September as Headteacher at Beaumont School. This follows a highly demanding and robust selection process which took place over two days this week. Following a rigorous longlisting, selected Headteacher candidates led mini assemblies, gave a presentation, took part in several tasks and completed five small panel interviews, including one with students, and one long interview with the Governors' Recruitment Panel. Mr Atkinson is currently Deputy Headteacher at the school and he and I have worked closely with each other to lead Beaumont forward. Mr Atkinson has the full support of staff and governors as well as the students and I am absolutely confident that he will be a great Headteacher for Beaumont.

On a different note, there has been much in the news this week about school funding reductions, some of which was raised by grammar school Headteachers. The situation is becoming increasingly challenging and is now further exacerbated by the proposals for a National Funding Formula which will impact negatively on most secondary schools in Hertfordshire. Further information can be found at https://consult.education.gov.uk/funding-policy-unit/schools-national-funding-formula2/ where you can give your views. However, it is probably most effective to lobby our local MP. I will aim to send an email to parents shortly with further information, following discussions with local Headteachers.

We welcome three new teachers this term, Miss McPhee (Drama), Miss Fitzpatrick (English) and Mrs Coyle (Psychology) and a new member of the premises staff, Mr Spalding and hope they will enjoy their time at Beaumont.

On Tuesday 17 January a small group of Year 9 gifted linguists had the opportunity to experience learning foreign languages at Downing College in the University of Cambridge. The course highlighted the benefits of learning languages, showed the advantages of languages to raising brain power and promoted the future of our Global Citizens. The aim of the day was to encourage communication skills and develop confidence in our learners. I was so proud of how brave our students were in trying out new skills and integrating themselves in to all the activities that were offered. They were introduced to Ambassadors of Cambridge University as well, to gain an insight as to what University life is like.

Spanish students were given the task to describe different Joan Miró paintings with lots of new vocabulary, thereby looking at culture and language learning. Everything was done in the target language and our students coped very well indeed.

Japanese was incredible. Our students learnt to say the numbers from 1 to 99 in about ten minutes! I am hoping that they will pass on their enthusiasm to their friends and that more people will be interested in learning other languages. The students also practised scribing their names in Japanese until they learnt to do so off by heart (sorry Alexander!) and then they made name badges out of origami penguins.

Another taster was in Mandarin Chinese, where we found out that it is supposedly even easier to learn than English, once you have mastered the tones (I still need to practise!). We studied numbers and hand gestures that are used at the same time. At the end we were having conversations in Mandarin with other students there.

I know that as a teacher I found the experience to be very interesting and enjoyable. The students were a credit and a joy to be with. Thank you.

Making drugs for money (legal drugs that is!)

As part of an assessed practical, Year 13 have been synthesising '2-ethanoyloxybenzoic acid' (aspirin to you and me!) They made the aspirin by a process called acylation. They then had to use recrystallization to purify the aspirin and test the purity by its melting temperature.

Samples were then sent to Loughborough University to check the purity using mass Spectrometry and infra - red Spectroscopy. Winners (for producing the purist drug) received Amazon vouchers. **Mr Parmar**

Steps in making Aspirin:

- 1 Carry out acylation reaction
- 2 Recrystallise to purify aspirin
- 3 Test purity of aspirin in school
- 4 Send test same to university



Making Aspirin

(1) Make the aspirin and then (2) test it using melting point tubes, and (3) send samples to a University to have it analysed using infra-red spectroscopy. The peak on the left is pure aspirin, the one on the right is an impurity. This aspirin was 99.1% pure!

On Saturday 17 December Beaumont School joined forces with local charity Herts for Refugees to do the Giant Donation Sort. Many students, their parents and members of the local community spent Saturday morning sorting donations of winter clothing and shoes and boots into banana boxes to be sent to refugees in Iraq and Syria. - Blankets, sleeping bags, sheets and towels in immaculate condition.
- Duvets, only if like new (no stains or marks)
- Wheelchairs, zimmer frames and crutches (paired)
- Moses baskets and baby bedding
- Disposable nappies, sanitary towels and incontinence pads (many of these items are very cheap for own brand in supermarkets)
- Care packs for mothers and babies


Our last Community, Teaching and Learning (CTL) meeting of the term concentrated on reviewing the Plan for School Improvement which provides Governors and the Leadership Team both with goals for the current academic year and with longer term priorities.
