Genius ideas from visiting writer Ali Sparkes

Year 7 and 8 students had the pleasure of meeting award-winning writer Ali Sparkes when she visited Beaumont earlier in November. Ali has had over forty books published and during her visit she introduced us to her fast-paced adventure story *Car-Jacked*. The book's main character Jack is a home-tutored child genius who finds himself on the run with bank robber and car stealer Ross as they try to evade the police, the bad guys and Jack's pushy, over-protective mum. The story follows the pair as they use their very different talents on a breathless chase from Scotland to London.

Addressing students and staff in the Hall, Ali set the scene as she read extracts from *Car-Jacked* and then went on to describe some of the research behind the story. As Jack has an IQ of 170, Ali contacted real-life child geniuses via Mensa (The High IQ Society) to ask what it was like to be super brainy? Ali also auditioned and appeared on the television quiz show The Chase, having previously appeared on Eggheads. Continuing the quiz theme, Ali's presentation included a How Clever Are You? Quiz for the audience. After testing students on maths, books, pi and Jupiter's moons, Ali declared that Beaumont is 'full of geniuses'! There was even a 'Quiz the Teachers' round with top spot going to Mrs Bennett. Ali rounded off her talk by encouraging our students to celebrate their 'brainy side'.

English Schools Cross Country – Round 1, Westminster Lodge

On Tuesday 10 October, our junior teams and inter girls' team competed in the first round of the National Schools' Cross Country Cup.

In the junior boys' race our top four scoring runners scored 65 points and were positioned in 5th place overall. William Houghton was placed 13th, a year out of age with Ben Humphreys 14th, Liam Hayes 17th and Owen Jones 21st. Our fifth runner home was Jake Berry in 43rd place.





The junior girls scored one point less than the boys (64) and were placed in fourth. Mia Pullan was 4th with Sarah McGrath not far behind in 8th. Meeka Nightingale and Sai Fisher, both in Year 7, were our other two scoring runners in 23rd and 29th respectively. Jaya Barker (30th) and Emily Denning (40th) were our other runners in a race where 62 runners competed.





The inter girls team were our most successful team on the day with our four scoring runners, placing as follows: Niamh Gallagher 4th, Bea Towers 10th, Hannah McCorkindale Brown 11th and Kate Riches 14th. Scarlett Parkes was 21st a year out of age and Ellie Flynn 29th. This was a great team performance based on the fact that over 65 runners ran.

From the Governors

The Resources Committee is back to the regular cycle of business and will meet for the second time this term in November. We said goodbye to our previous chair of the committee, Rena Prindiville, at the end of the last term and I have now taken on the role for this year. Change in senior school leadership has been more obvious in terms of personnel although in the operation of the school the Governors hope this transition has been smooth.

Secondary Transfer Evening took place in early October with students, staff and governors on hand to present the school to all prospective families. Students, in particular, were keen to showcase the many areas of the school in a positive light. The Governing Body aims to provide facilities that match the high standard of teaching. The replacement of windows and guttering to the main school building is very apparent from the outside and should provide a better learning environment for students throughout the year. In addition, work continues within the school in developing plans for the proposed new science building in conjunction with the appointed consultants. A planning application for the new building is anticipated to be submitted for this building shortly.

Works continue on the old playing fields and the new junction on Hatfield Road by the housing developer. Utility diversion works are reportedly nearing completion with the end to temporary disruption to traffic. This will then enable access to the school site to be modified to tie in with the school's changes that were preempted through the sports hall development.
