From the Headteacher

It has been an excellent start to the new academic year and my first year as Headteacher at Beaumont. The superb examination results this summer have provided a spring board of positivity for staff and students alike. Our A Level results were outstanding with 41% of grades at A* or A and an average points score per exam entry of 40 (a B grade), this score would have placed us in the top 1% of comprehensive schools for attainment in the previous year. At GCSE the results were equally impressive with 86% of students achieving at least a standard pass in English and Mathematics and 69% achieving a strong pass or better. As a school we were particularly pleased with the number of grade '9s' achieved in both English and Mathematics. For more detail on results do refer to the new school website. I was delighted to attend the district 'Fun Run' where Beaumont students put on an excellent show and the girls won the team competition. The Year 7 BBQ was a real success with great attendance despite the weather! At the other end of the school we have had record numbers join the sixth form, now totalling 345 students. Plans for the new Science block are developing well and we hope to see permissions granted and construction beginning after Christmas.

Finally, a warm welcome to all our new staff. They are Mr Mountstevens (Deputy Headteacher), Mr Langley (PE), Mr Malak who trained here last year (D&T), Mrs Bettison (Science), Mrs Cox (Drama), Mr Goodhand who also trained with us last year (Economics & Business), Ms Beaumont (Maths), Mrs Lewis (Art Technician), Mr Medforth who was a former student (Teaching Assistant), Miss Dines (Teaching Assistant), Ms Parkinson (Teaching Assistant), Mrs Bedi (Finance Assistant), Mr Robertson (Caretaker). In addition we welcome four staff who will be training with us this year: Mrs Dunn, Miss Cooper, Miss Jordan and Miss Haynes.

Presenting The Giver as our latest whole school read

The school year got off to an exciting start in the Library with the launch of Lois Lowry's book *The Giver* as our new Beaumont Reads/whole-school read. This powerful novel, set in a not-too-distant future, tells the story of Jonas and his

life in what, at first glance, appears to be a perfect world. Here there is no discord or war or pain, lives are ordered and comfortable, strong emotions are controlled by pills and memories do not exist. In this model society, people strive for 'Sameness' and have a fear of being different. Nine-year-old Jonas' world is turned upside-down when he meets the Giver and becomes the Receiver of Memory. Jonas discovers that, with memories, come powerful emotions and sensations, both positive and painful. This new knowledge makes Jonas question his world and forces him to make the most difficult decision of his life.

The Giver is a truly compelling and thought-provoking book. Over the coming weeks we will be encouraging as many students, parents and staff as possible to read, review and share the book. We will support the book across the curriculum through a range of activities and events.

In the team event, there was one point between first and second and we secured first place with 93 points, with Sandringham second with 94. Beaumont School is a member of the Alban Federation partnership in the area of teacher training. Each year the Federation trains a large number of adults (53 in 2017/18), either straight from university with their degrees, or people who are changing careers, and places them in a host school for the year to enable them to complete their training and gain Qualified Teacher Status. All applications are submitted through UCAS (the University Admission System) and this is scheduled to open on 26 October 2017, for courses starting in September 2018. Courses are available for both Primary and Secondary programmes, with salaries or bursaries available for suitably qualified candidates in many subjects.

If you are interested in becoming a teacher and would like to find out more about how to apply and what is involved, we are holding an **Open Morning on Saturday 14 October 2017** in the Sixth Form Centre at Sandringham School in St Albans. It runs from 9.30am to midday and you are more than welcome to come along and meet current trainees and course tutors. Equally, if you know of anyone who is keen to train to teach, this will be a very useful event for them to attend.
