
Robot Rumble, Saturday 20 January 2018

Six Year 9 students at Beaumont School took part in the Robot Rumble final event, held at the University of Hertfordshire on Saturday 20 January. The competition is organised by MBDA, Stevenage, who provided graduates to support schools during the entire process. Students have been preparing for the event for over six months, designing, building programming their robot to complete the challenges of the competition. were matched up in alliances, to play against other alliances, aiming to score the most points. Students also had to prepare and deliver a five minute presentation to the judges, detailing the engineering problems and solutions achieved by their robot.

A logbook was also written, as a record of the research and development of ideas, followed by reasoning behind the decisions made regarding the building and engineering of the robot. Students battled hard, against some very tough opposition, place achieving fourteenth overall. Students enjoyed the challenge of all the activities and have improved their skills in engineering, programming, problem solving, communication and teamwork.

The Resources Committee met at the end of January during a short but busy spring term for the school. Governors reviewed monthly financial reports for the recent periods and provided scrutiny of information provided. Governors continue to be impressed when monitoring spend against budget particularly in the light of challenging financial circumstances in education. Governors also received an update on fundraising activities and plans for use of the funds raised to date.

I recently attended the Chairs' briefing held by Herts for Learning. A range of subjects were discussed and the issue of exam stress was covered. Support can be provided through a number of routes but an anonymous online resource, kooth.com, was promoted. This is a site that is accessible by students outside of the school environment.

The committee is responsible for oversight of the premises and is pleased with two recent developments. Firstly, the school recently submitted a planning application for the proposed new Science block in conjunction with the appointed consultants. This is for development funded by Hertfordshire Country Council to support a planned increased need for school places. Secondly, new fencing has been installed in preparation for the eventual opening of the school entrance off Hatfield Road which will enhance the security of the site for all.


For the guide book task, the overall winner was Danny Fawcett (8A) with Saffi de Bella (8S) and Tom Mumford (8R) as the runners up.



Beaumont runners push for county team selection at Herts Schools Cross Country **Championships**

On Saturday 3 February students from Years 7 to 12 represented Beaumont at the Herts Schools Cross Country Championships at Westminster Lodge. A top five finish ensured selection for the County Squad in each age group with the top 8 having a good chance for final selection. In the Senior Girls age group Emily Anders finished 8th whilst in the Inter Girls, Bea Towers finished 23rd and Niamh Gallagher also 8th (both Bea and Niamh running a year out

The Inter Boys race saw Thomas Cooper finish 21st out of the 52 runners, whilst in the Junior Girls Scarlett Parkes finished 38th whilst Mia Pullan was 8th and Sarah McGrath 4th, both also a year out of age. In the Pre-Junior Girls, Sai Fisher was 16th and Meeka Nightingale was 15th out of a field of 61 runners.

All of the runners braved cold and wet conditions, did a great job and it is possible that we may have 4 runners representing Hertfordshire at the National Schools Championships later this term. A really positive end to a very successful season.


