There are three strands to the summer home-learning:

- Wider-reading
- Introduction to the film “Entre les Murs”
- Grammar

This work has been designed to:

- Prepare you for the demands of the A-Level course
- Help you get into the habit of wider-reading and research
- Bring your grammar up to scratch

You should have this work ready for the **first lesson back**. At the start of the year you will have a diagnostic grammar test.

Over the summer you should also ensure that you:

- Get hold of a “big” French dictionary, either Collins or Oxford. These usually cost around £30, but you will be able to get them cheaper on Amazon or in second hand bookshops.
- Set out your folder for the year. You will need a lever-arch file with sub-dividers for at least each of the six “themes”, the film “Entre les Murs”, grammar, and wider reading.

For the new A-Level course you will actually be marked on your wider knowledge of the themes studied and how they relate to French speaking countries. You are expected to read around the themes on a weekly basis, and you should get yourself into this habit now.

Entre les Murs



In year 12 you will be studying the film “Entre les Murs” (English title: The Class). Over the summer you must get hold of a copy of the film (fairly easily available on Amazon) and should watch the film in its entirety. Make sure that you buy a copy with English subtitles!

Answer the following questions about the film once you have watched it (or whilst watching it):

Comprehension

- 1. Why does Koumba refuse to read aloud a passage from “The Diary of Anne Frank”?

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- 2. Which French word does Monsieur Marin use to describe Esméralda and Louise that causes much upset and controversy?

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- 3. What is the subject of the essay Koumba writes in the film?

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- 4. What happens to Wei’s mother and why?

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- 5. What phrase does Souleymane have tattooed on him which he uses to justify his silence during the class?

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Interpretation

- 1. Do you think Monsieur Marin goes too far in his criticism of Esméralda and Louise?

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2. What social and racial tensions are exposed in the film?

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3. Do you believe that this film belongs more to the genre of documentary or the genre of fiction?

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4. To what extent do you think Monsieur Marin is the “hero” of this film?

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5. What do you believe is the significance of the film’s title?

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Grammar

1. The present tense:

- regular -er, -ir, -re verb formation with all pronouns
- irregular verbs: aller / avoir / être / faire / pouvoir / vouloir / devoir / boire / écrire / lire / prendre (see table below)

2. The past tense:

- regular –er/ -ir / -re verbs which take the auxiliary verb ‘avoir’ and how to form past participles
- irregular past participles (see table below)
- verbs which take the auxiliary verb ‘être’ (MRS VAN DE TRAMP) and how to make the past participles agree

avoir = eu	être = été	faire = fait
boire = bu	conduire = conduit	connaître = connu
courir = couru	croire = cru	devoir = dû
dire = dit	dormir = dormi	écrire = écrit
falloir = fallu	lire = lu	mettre = mis
ouvrir = ouvert	pleuvoir = plu	prendre = pris comprendre = compris apprendre = appris
pouvoir = pu	recevoir = reçu	rire = ri
savoir = su	tenir = tenu	vivre = vécu
voir = vu	vouloir = voulu	suivre = suivi

3. The future tense

- regular –er/ -ir / -re verbs and endings for all pronouns (ai, as, a, ons, ez, ont)
- irregular verb stems* (see table below)

4. The imperfect tense:

- regular formation (present tense nous form, remove –ons) and endings for all pronouns (ais, ais, ait, ions, iez, aient) *NB. être the only irregular verb in the imperfect
- être / avoir / faire / aller/ vouloir / pouvoir / devoir

5. The conditional tense

- regular –er/-ir/-re verbs and endings for all pronouns (ais, ais, ait, ions, iez, aient)
- irregular verb stems* (see table below)

*Irregular verb stems in the future and conditional tenses:
