
Students meet award-winning author Lisa Thompson, St Albans Schools' Book Award Discussion Day

Thirteen of our Year 7s had a fantastic day out in December when they represented Beaumont at the annual St Albans Schools' Book Award (SASBA) 2019. The SASBA is a collaborative initiative aimed at encouraging reading and bringing students from together Hertfordshire schools. Students who take part are required to read the three fiction books shortlisted by their school librarians. The books on the 2019 shortlist were: Boy Underwater by Adam Baron, The Children of Castle Rock by Natasha Farrant and No Fixed Address by Susin Nielsen.

The award process culminated in a Discussion Day at St Columba's College in December. Around 60 students from eight schools took part in this year's SASBA and, as in previous years, the Discussion Day was a busy event. Students spent time sharing their thoughts and opinions on the shortlisted titles, they were treated to video messages from each of the shortlisted authors and also took part in a number of quizzes with the chance to win books and sweets! At the end of the discussion, each student was asked to vote for the book they wanted to win this year's award.

The day was made even more memorable when writer Lisa Thompson, winner of last year's SASBA for her book The Goldfish Boy, joined us at St Columba's. Lisa listened to all the students' book discussions and then gave a very engaging talk about her work and her books, from rough outline to first draft to publication. The students thoroughly enjoyed hearing Lisa describe her journey to becoming a writer, especially when she told them that when she was 4 years old she actually wanted to be Wonder Woman!







At the end of the day, Lisa revealed the results of the student vote, announcing No Fixed Address by Susin Nielsen as the winner of the SASBA 2019. Many congratulations to Susin Nielsen who holds a special place at Beaumont since she visited the school back in 2018 all the way from her home in Canada, Susin's books for young people tackle tough

social issues with warmth and humour and are always popular with our readers.

We would like to thank the thirteen Year 7 readers who brought their enthusiasm and book knowledge to the Discussion Day.
