

Celebrating our whole school read with a very special visit from with Richard Blair

Beaumont students and staff were given a fascinating insight into the life of writer George Orwell when his son, Richard Blair, visited the school in February. *Animal Farm*, Orwell's classic fable and political allegory, has been our whole school read for 2019/20 and we were delighted that Mr Blair could join us to celebrate and bring the curtain down on this year's 'Beaumont Reads' scheme. Over the past three months, students and staff have been exploring *Animal Farm* through a variety of cross-curricular events and activities. This is our fifth whole school read and, as in previous years, all those who read the book and wrote a review received a commemorative badge. Students were very keen to add this year's 'All Animals Are Equal' badge to their Beaumont Reads collection!







During his visit, Mr Blair joined staff for lunch in the library. He then addressed around 150 students from Years 7 to 11 in the Hall. In an enthralling talk, Mr Blair shared childhood stories and family photographs, bringing to life many of the events that shaped George Orwell's writing. In a Q and A session, Mr Blair also answered a number of interesting questions from the students, many of which focused on *Animal Farm*. At the end of his talk, Mr Blair showed some of the students a special edition of *Animal Farm*, beautifully bound and personally dedicated to him.

Mr Blair brought a very personal touch to our Beaumont Reads scheme. Students and staff spoke highly of his visit. Here is what some of our students had to say:
