


Beyond Beaumont



From the Trustees

The Resources Committee met for the first time this academic year in the middle of September. A major topic for discussion was the school's energy contracts which have recently come up for renewal. As you can image the current energy situation has meant that the deals we might have accessed in previous years were simply not available. As Trustees, we work closely with the school to agree the best deal possible and while inevitably costs will rise, the sound financial position of the school means that any increase can be comfortably covered.

The Resources Committee also considered the ongoing COVID situation, as a standing agenda item. The school carefully monitors case numbers and has taken the precautionary step of reinstating some additional safety measures, for example mask wearing, due to a recent small increase in cases. I am pleased to see that we have continued to see high levels of compliance with the twice-weekly testing.

I was disappointed to see that a small number of anti-vaccination protesters targeted the school in the run up to the on-site vaccination sessions. I should note that the school is not able to stop people handing out leaflets on the public highway outside the school site. I know the decision whether or not to vaccinate has been a difficult one for some parents and I feel strongly that the decision should lie with parents and students alone, supported by the school acting in a neutral manner. I would like to thank the school staff for the swift action taken to ensure safety/security and provide reassurance for the students. The students themselves acted in a responsible and mature way when faced with actions which I know some found quite intimidatory. The committee meets again later this term when we will continue to monitor the COVID situation, but will also focus on financial oversight as we prepare for filing our annual **David Lee, Chair Resources Committee** accounts.
