COURSE AIMS:

During the course, students will learn about the significance of events, individuals, issues and societies in history; how and why societies have changed over time; the theories of historians and the language that they use to discuss their ideas; to understand the nature of historical evidence and the methods used by historians to analyse and evaluate it; to develop an understanding of how the past has been interpreted and represented; to express your own historical ideas confidently and effectively.

QUALIFICATIONS, QUALITIES, EXPERIENCE DESIRABLE

The course will appeal to students who have an interest in the past and enjoy investigation and discovery; who enjoy debate and like putting forward a well-argued case; who want to study a subject which encourages them to consider evidence and make up their own minds to reach well-informed judgements. A Level History complements a range of other A Levels as you consider a range of perspectives in a logical and analytical way. History is regarded as a highly useful qualification for a wide range of higher education or career choices.

TEACHING & LEARNING METHODS

The course is mainly taught through investigating different aspects of each course. Gathering information, zooming into causes, experience, impact and significance is common practice. Sources and interpretations are often analysed as important ways to deepen knowledge and reach substantiated judgements. Students are provided with time and support when planning essays, both in class and outside of the classroom. By the end of the A Level, students at Beaumont have been taught how to reach logical and well-informed judgements.

HOMEWORK

Students are expected to undertake about two to three hours home learning per week during Year 12. Structured assignments are set, as well as independent research and reading activities. This independent research is particularly important when completing coursework.

COMPLEMENTARY SUBJECTS

Students have always combined History with a wide range of subjects, including Languages, Sciences and Maths. Students often complement their study of History with English, Geography and Politics.

TRIPS & VISITS

Students may have the opportunity to take part in History conferences in London during the course. The cost of a conference is approximately £20, plus travelling expenses.

MATERIALS

Textbooks must be purchased prior to the course starting in September. The school library also has books for wider reading.
