There are two qualifying galas in September (girls) and October (boys). Times from these galas are then used to select for a national final in the London Aquatics Centre in November. The team competition is then over for the year.

Milton Mountaineers is a charity group of blind and partially sighted hill walkers and sighted friends and relations who meet in different parts of the UK to climb hills or mountains in the area. Recently, Year 7 student Phillippa Cowen helped guide a group of walkers and here is her story.

"I first got involved on the Milton Mountaineers 50th anniversary when I was nine years old. My great grandfather David Scott Blackhall started the charity as his own eyesight started to deteriorate when he was in his teens and then went completely blind by 45, but he still had a love for walking.



"This year we were in a place called Whitby and most of us walked over 25 miles across a span of three days, either guiding somebody or just enjoying the views. I guided a different person each day and it was a really unique experience for me because it's amazing to hear what they go through every day just to live as normally as they can."

Carnegie and cakes - good times in the Library

The annual <u>Carnegie</u> Medal book prize spotlights the best of contemporary fiction for children and young adults. Each year we follow, or 'shadow', the award with students. This involves reading at least six of the eight shortlisted books, writing reviews and joining other shadowers for regular discussion sessions in the Library. This year, there are 35 students in the Beaumont shadowing group, wonderfully entitled the Bookiewookiedoodahs. This group brings together students from across Years 7 to 10 and gives them a fantastic opportunity to share their feelings and opinions with other readers. Our lunchtime get-togethers have been lively affairs, with hours of insightful book chat about the shortlisted titles, graced with a selection of the librarians' homemade, Carnegie-themed cakes and biscuits.

The Bookiewookiedoodahs have already written and published 40 book reviews on their own shadowing group page on the official Carnegie Medal website. Here are Edie's thoughts on the shortlisted verse novel The Crossing by Manjeet Mann.

"I loved this book, I think it was so powerful, I liked the way it balances out the seriousness with sections of humour whilst including serious topics such as homophobia and racism. It took me a while to understand the way the multiple points of views were set out but as I continued reading, it became clear. I thought that the family aspect of this book was very emotional and that the message behind how to treat others in relationships was strong. At several points whilst reading I was on the verge of tears, which just made me think, if this is how I am feeling from a reader's perspective, how must it feel for the people that have experienced that in the past? I think that the way the author chose to set out a page with the person's name and their lifespan was heart-warming and showed just how much she understands that it is a sensitive topic for some people."

From the Trustees

Trustees on the Community, Teaching and Learning (CTL) Committee meet twice a term.

At our meeting in March, we considered Departmental Reviews which had been distributed before the meeting. Reviews had not taken place during Covid so this was a good opportunity for us to gain insight into the process and content of reviews once again.

Areas of focus include actions from the last review, an evaluation of curriculum intent and pedagogy, and entail activities such as lesson visits, student consultation, looking at student work where appropriate, and department consultation. Trustees linked to departments are often involved in the review process, including talking to students. Overall, the reviews were very positive and informed plans for continuing development.

A Level and GCSE examinations are underway, having started on 16 May and will be finishing towards the end of June. Students are sitting external examinations for the first time since the pandemic began and after two years of centre-assessed and teacher-assessed grades. This year the dates of exam papers are spread further apart than usual to help ensure that if a student becomes ill, they will not miss all their exams in a subject.

Trustees wish students in Years 11 and 13 all the very best with their exams and future plans.

As ever, we would like to extend our thanks to students, parents/ carers and school staff for their ongoing dedication and hard work.




