Timetable

- 6 timetabled lessons for each subject
- Additional timetabled study periods register taken
- Attendance at morning registration 4 timetabled days?
- Study periods register taken
- Thursday morning Form time, assembly and PSHE



Attendance & Punctuality

- Students must attend <u>all</u> timetabled sessions. A register is taken and your attendance will be monitored
 - If you miss a timetabled session, a text will be sent home to find out why
- Students must be punctual to <u>all</u> timetabled sessions
 - Persistent lateness will result in school detentions or the removal of the ability to leave school site during the day

- Please be aware of procedures for notifying absences and for students signing in and out of school.




Dress Code

- The dress code is displayed around school and is in the Sixth Form Handbook.
- Students must wear their lanyard at all times whilst on the school site.
- We see the opportunity to make a mature judgement about dress as an important part of the transition towards leaving compulsory full time education.
 - If students are not dressed appropriately, they will be asked to wear a Beaumont T-shirt or leave the school site to change.

Preparing for Beyond Beaumont

Students can expect support for the following in preparing for next year:

- UCAS applications
- Apprenticeships and other opportunities
- Personal Statements and applications
- Financial preparation
- Wider understanding of life skills needed when leaving home and school
- Looking after their health

Most of this support will be provided through their tutor time and PSHE lessons.



Preparing for Beyond Beaumont

What is expected FROM students in preparing for next year?

- Meeting deadlines (internal, for UCAS and other applications)
- Communication from them about their aspirations and support they might need
- Completing their EMPLOYER CONTACT PROGRAMME
- Keeping up with communication sent to them- via GC and emails
- Full attendance at all timetabled sessions each week
- Passing on information to their parents/carers as appropriate
- Being proactive in looking after their own mental and physical health
- Engaging fully with discussions to allow them to share ideas with their peers



Academic Study

Students can expect the following in their academic lessons and study in Year 13:

- Teachers who want to ensure they have completed all the required skills and knowledge for their subjects
- Revision and study support in each subject as they prepare for both Mock Exams and the External Exams next Summer
- Study space and opportunities during the school day to ensure they can undertake independent study
- Being pushed to achieve at their best in each subject
- Teachers who will support them when they are working at a topic which they find difficult



Academic Study

What is expected FROM students in their academic lessons and study in Year 13:

- Full attendance and full engagement at all times in lessons
- Completion of all work set by deadlines
- A willingness to undertake the independent study needed in order to achieve at the highest level
- Being prepared to ask questions, ask for clarification, ask for support and being proactive in communicating with teachers
- A strong commitment to doing what is needed for them to be successful in their goals for the year



School Community

Students can expect the following in the school community in Year 13:

- Being role models for all students in the school (including the new Year 12 students)
- Being asked to undertake tasks and responsibilities which involve leading and contribute to the wider running of the school and specific departments
- The opportunity to develop and pursue their own interests through setting up their own societies
- A range of activities provided each week for Well-Being Wednesday



School Community

What is expected FROM students in their role in the school community in Year 13:

- Demonstrating through their actions that they can be a strong and positive role model (eg dress, punctuality, manner of communication with others)
- Being proactive in seeking opportunities to contribute to the wider running of the school community (continuing or taking on a new contribution to the community role; pastoral mentoring; leading or setting up a society)
- Communicating with staff (teachers, form tutors) when they are concerned about any of their peers or actions which concern them.
- Engaging in the opportunities which are provided to develop a sense of community in the Sixth Form



Employer Contact Programme

- ❖ 30 hours of "Employer Contact Time" by 31 December Year 13.
- Students should complete the Spreadsheet record of all their different contact hours. This should be PRINTED, signed by you as parent/carer and then handed in to their tutor.








What students do

- Accept two offers







UCAS and You

- Their application
- The student must add personal details, choices and personal statement
- They must make payment to UCAS and submit by deadline to school for us to add school reference

UCAS and Beaumont

- We monitor their progress on applications
- Once paid and submitted, we add a school reference and forward to UCAS





Deadlines

- Student completion by internal deadline of Sunday 29th October ensures UCAS receive application by Christmas
- Oxbridge and medic applications required by 1st October
- Please remember compiling student references takes time
