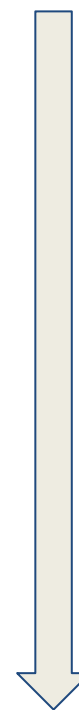


Our focus this year

- ❖ Provide opportunities for students to develop a wide range of skills whilst feeling part of a wider community

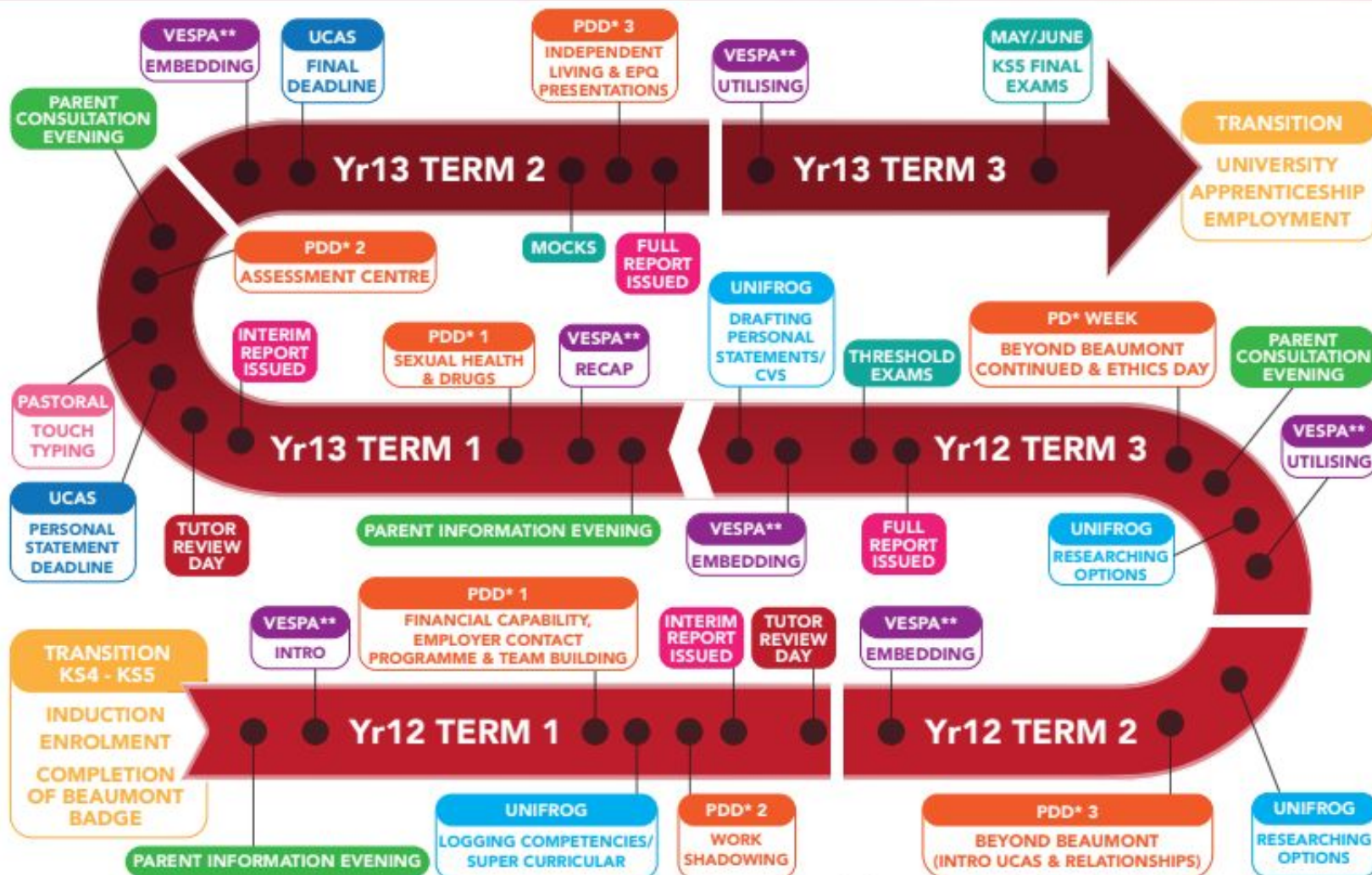

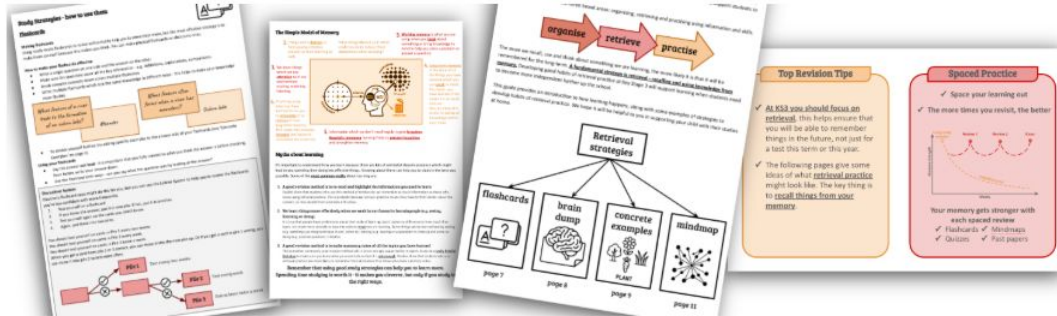
Timetable

- ❖ Thursday morning - form time and pastoral curriculum
- ❖ Personal Development Days each term

Home Learning & Independent Study

- ❖ Students are expected to complete 4.5 hours worth of study per subject per week
- ❖ Weekly, teachers will set home learning tasks to be completed - students who fail to meet the deadlines will be set a lunch detention
- ❖ Detentions will run Wednesday and Friday lunchtime in school

Study Skills

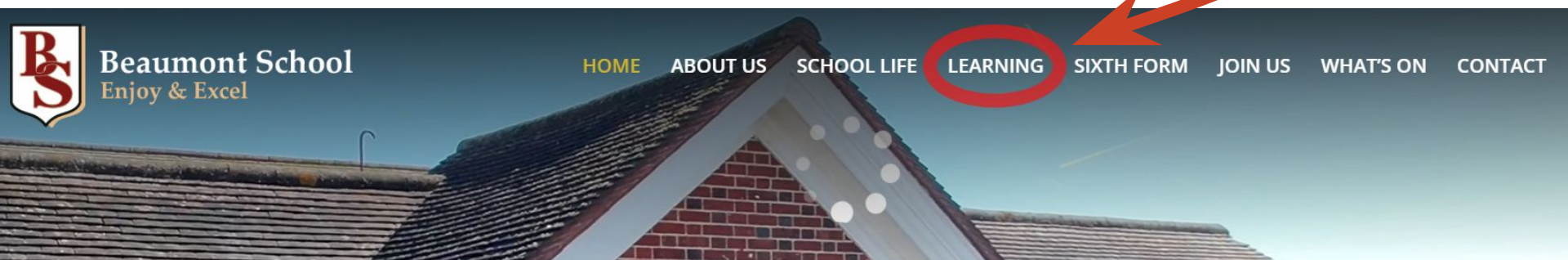


At Beaumont we pride ourselves on our excellent teaching, but students will benefit most from this if they also develop strong independent study skills.

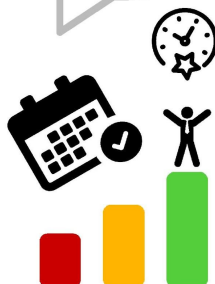

Threshold Exams

- ❖ Determine Year 13 transition
 - Need to pass to progress
 - Alternative 16-19 paths possible if change is needed
- ❖ Results determine forecast grades for university applications and for company career programmes

SEND Access Arrangements

- ❖ Access arrangements are not an automatic rollover. You will need to demonstrate that you still need this at that it is your normal way of working
- ❖ For new to Beaumont students we need your evidence of access arrangements from your current school
- ❖ Please contact your school this term. Deadline for documentation is **18th September 2026**

Private Language Exams

- ❖ If you would like your child to sit a GCSE or A Level in their home language, please email **exams@beaumont.school** before the October half term
- ❖ Requests submitted after the deadline may not be considered
- ❖ We encourage students to sit home language exams in Year 12, allowing them to concentrate on their other A Levels in Year 13

Student Handbook

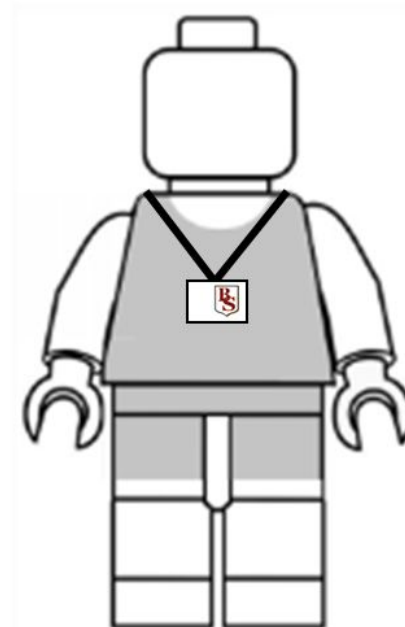
- ❖ A key reference document for all students

- ❖ Staff will actively look to detect and deter possible malpractice through the use of AI to maintain the academic integrity of our curriculum and assessment practice

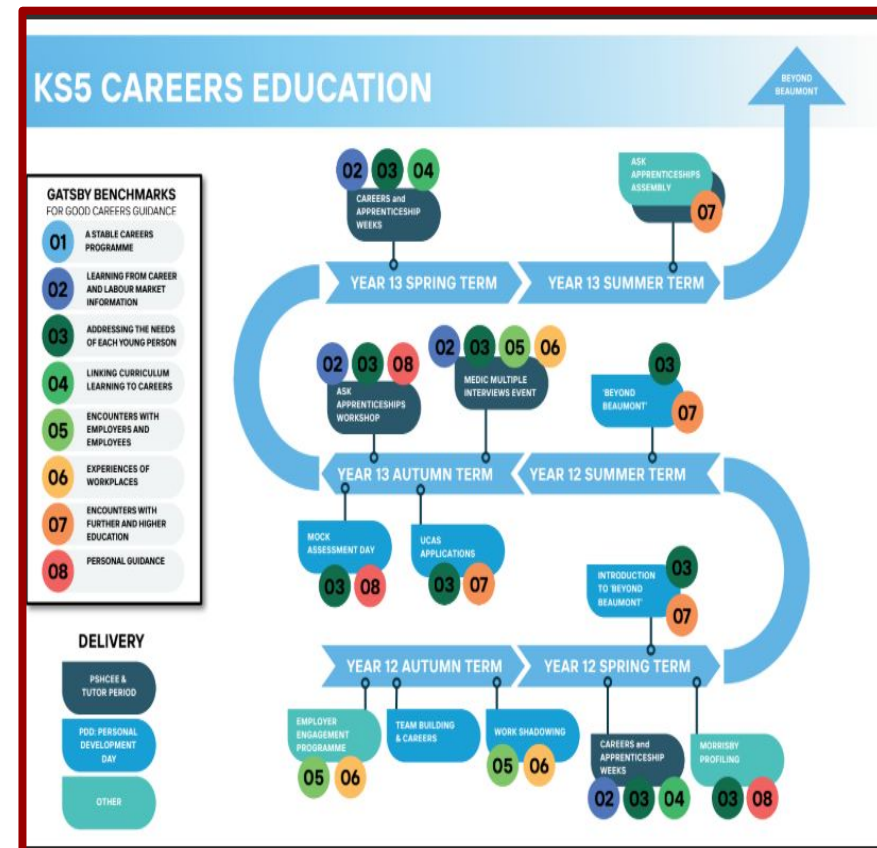

Safeguarding – advice to parents

- It is never too late to establish rules on the use of devices and the internet.
- Keep up-to-date (our [website](#) has some really useful links) and internetmatters.org is absolutely fantastic
- Have conversations – be open and discuss what your children are doing online (without judgment)
- ‘Follow’ your child’s account
- Privacy settings – check yours and your children’s. Update and don’t ignore!



Safeguarding – child on child abuse

What is the school's stance?

- Zero Tolerance Approach; it will not be tolerated. There will be consequences
- It is not “just banter”, “just having a laugh”, “part of growing up” or “boys being boys”
